



2024 Incentives for Local Government Grant Program Report

December 23, 2024

Purpose of the Report

To provide an annual update regarding the Incentives for Local Government (ILG) Grant Program, as required and outlined in HB22-1011.

Background

The ILG Grant Program, administered by the Colorado State Forest Service (CSFS), was created during the 2022 legislative session when the Colorado General Assembly passed House Bill 22-1011.

This competitive grant program provides state funding assistance to local governments that dedicate revenue for local forest management and wildfire mitigation efforts. The funding is intended to either match revenue raised by such governments from a dedicated revenue source or to expand existing programs administered by the local government on a long-term basis.

ILG Grant Process

The CSFS received \$10 million to develop and administer the ILG Grant Program. In March 2023, the CSFS released a call for applications detailing the program eligibility requirements. The application period closed in April, and CSFS employees reviewed applications and announced awards in May.

2023 ILG Applicant Summary

The CSFS received 31 eligible applications totaling just over \$14.7 million of requests for increased staffing, equipment purchases and fuels reduction treatments on approximately 11,000 acres. The CSFS issued awards to 28 applicants totaling \$18.25 million of project work (\$9.5 million grant share, \$8.75 million match contribution), leaving approximately \$5.2 million of unfunded grant share requests. Table 1 displays the distribution of requests and awards by county, and Figure 1 is a map depicting Colorado counties that received an ILG award.

ILG Project Accomplishments

To date, 935 acres have been treated and several capacity-related efforts are underway. The capacity efforts that have been reported include the completion of a CWPP update, delivery of multiple community outreach events, identification of future treatment areas, delivery of successful community chipping program, multiple community equipment purchases and several mitigation positions filled to continue the planning and implementing of wildfire risk reduction treatments. Five ILG projects have concluded totaling \$932,214 of project work (\$384,063 grant share, \$548,151 match contribution).
